

I have had the pleasure of meeting Craig and we had a tour of the course and, he was impressed with what he saw.



Practice Facilities

Progress continues on the practice nets and the old first tee area which will eventually be the new practice putting green.

To facilitate practice and warm ups before play until these are completed the "new" 18th green and "new" 17th fairway are designated practice areas.

They can also be used on competition days until the first playing group uses them, but then they can no longer be used for practice. Areas where bunkers have been replaced by mounds will continue to be GUR.

These areas will be continued to be monitored by the Golf Committee and brought into play at an appropriate time.



The General Manager's Report by John Sedunary



A Plea to all Members

Like everyone else and every business, we have been hit with price increases in the last few months. The rises have touched every part of the Club, literally nothing has escaped.

We have tried to work around the increases as best we can, but now the inevitable has arrived. We have been forced to slightly increase the Fairways bar and bistro prices. They are still good value and provide excellent value.

The last few years have been very difficult financially for the club, as we battled Covid with declining income and mounting debt. Meanwhile, the last few months have started to show the club's true potential:

- ▢ Growing numbers of people joining as golf, bowls or, social members
- ▢ Increasing numbers dining at our Bistro
- ▢ Outstanding feedback about our food, our service and, our golf course
- ▢ Increasing income

However, we are still bound up by debt – some new and some old. For example:

1.	Renovation Loan:	\$1.9m	(Payable over 10 years)
2.	Consolidated loan:	\$460k	(Payable over 10 Years)
3.	ATO:	\$300K	(Payable over 2 years)
4.	Entitlements:	\$1.7m	(Payable over 7 years)
	Total:	\$4.36m	

That equates to over \$32k per month, just to repay the loans. On top of that, our total expenses bill, is around \$240k per month. Our income is less than that – at the moment. But we are striving to build more revenue by offering more services to our members.

You will hear much more about that in the coming weeks.

The Maryborough Golf Club can continue in the state it is in. It is simple as that.

I ask that you come in and support the Club by:

- ▢ Joining in on members nights and especially staying for a meal
- ▢ Come and bring your friends for a meal and a drink

We work hard to keep our costs down so that the Board and its Committees can invest in our members. The more your help by spending here at the Club, you are investing in the future of the Maryborough Golf Club.
