CARE OF THE COURSE

Bunkers:

Before leaving a bunker, a player should carefully fill up and smooth all holes and footprints. Bunker rakes to be left on the bunker stand in the bunker.

Divots, Ball Marks and Spike Marks:

Through the green, a player should ensure that any turf cut or displaced is replaced at once and covered with a light coating of sand. Damage to greens caused by a ball or spikes must be repaired upon completion of the hole.

Damage to Greens – Flagsticks, bags etc

Players should ensure that when placing down bags or the flagstick, no damage is done to the putting green and that neither they, or their caddies damage the hole by standing too close to it, in handling the flagstick or removing the ball from the hole. The flagstick should be properly replaced in the hole before players leave the putting green. Players should not damage the green by leaning on their putters, particularly when removing the ball from the hole.

Damage through practice swings:

In taking practice swings, players should avoid causing damage to the course, particularly the tees, by removing divots.

Sand buckets must be carried, always.

Wide wheel tyres (slicks) are compulsory on buggies, always.

Ride- On Carts

Ride on carts **MUST** be kept at least five metres from the edge of greens to ensure that these areas are maintained at the highest possible level.

LOCAL RULES

Temporary Local Rules which may become necessary from time to time, are posted on the notice board at the clubhouse entrance adjacent to the first tee.

PRACTICE

To assist members who wish to practice, the following options are available:

- Use of the practice nets at any time.
- Practice area on the 17th fairway **other than competition times.**
- Use of fairways and greens at times **other than competition times,** (maximum 3 balls) provided the member uses a sand bucket to repair divots. This includes options such as after Saturday, Tuesday and Wednesday competitions have been completed.

Priority must be given, always, to ground staff and players playing a competition. Green fee players and practice rounds can be played on competition days after the competition is completed or at the discretion of the Club.

DRESS

Members are required to be neatly and correctly attired both on the course and in the clubhouse. Dress standards will be at Committee discretion.

CONDITIONS OF PLAY (MEN AND WOMEN)
(Including competitions)

1. All competitors must be available for starting **10 minutes** before the appointed time.
2. On Club competition days, before commencing play, **each competitor is requested to enter the competition by entering their name on the time sheet and computerised system, and by lodging an entry fee in the appropriate place.** Withdrawal from the competition after entry and return of entry fee will be at the Committee's discretion.
3. At the end of a competition round each player **must** return their score card bearing their playing handicap, a score for each hole and signed by the player and marker, or use the MiScore App, with a penalty of disqualification. Completion of other information on the scorecard, and entry of their score on the computerised system, would greatly assist those organising the competition.
4. Players shall not continue to play when the ball has no bearing on the results and all scoring shots have been completed.
5. Players shall not mark their card on the putting greens nor shall they do so when they should be hitting off on the next hole.
6. **All matches in knock-out competitions shall commence at the 1st hole** and must be played on or before the specified dates. If competitors fail to reach agreement, then the last day for that round shall be the time for play. Should one competitor (or team) not be at the tee at 1.00 p.m. on that day, the opponent(s) shall be deemed the winner(s) by forfeit. If both are absent, both shall be disqualified. In exceptional circumstances, the above condition may be varied by prior agreement with the Match Committee.
7. In four ball events, should a partner who has entered for that event become unavailable, the player without a partner is to play with lowest handicapped player in the paired group, except for Board Events and lead up events, and any other events designated by the Golf Committee, when every player must have their own partner.
8. The lowest marker is the captain of each group of players and is responsible for seeing that the group observes the rules and etiquette of golf.
9. In Club events a Junior Member's scorecard must be marked by a member (i.e. a maximum of two junior members in each group of four competitors) Match Committee to decide in exceptional circumstances.
10. In case of emergency the following will apply
 - Discontinue play for dangerous situation (i.e. immediate suspension): One prolonged note of the siren.
 - Discontinue play for a non-dangerous situation: Three consecutive notes of the siren, repeated.
 - Resume play: Two short notes of siren, repeated.

SPECIAL EVENTS (MEN)

NOTE: All knockout contests **MUST** start at the 1st tee.

NOTE: Intermediate and Summer members are not eligible to win board events, or matches which lead up to board events.

August : **Winter Cup** played over three rounds (Stroke, Par, Stableford) with points (10 – 1) allocated to the top ten places in each round. Winner determined by player with the greatest number of points accumulated over the three rounds.

August : **Tom Bembridge Cup**

September : Top 8 pairs qualify for the **Summer 4BBB Matchplay Competition.**

Subsequent rounds to be played by the dates specified in the fixture. Handicaps applied as in Phelan Knockout.

October : **Medallist of the Year.** Open to the eligible season's medal winners. Ties decided on count-back.

November: **Club Championships** played over 54 holes.

See **RULES OF PLAY FOR CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP (MEN)** for details.

February : **Four Ball Championships** played over 36 holes.

February : **Herb McKinley Cup**

March : Qualifying round of **Peck Trophy.** Top 8 qualify for singles Match Play Knockout to be played by dates specified in fixture. Handicaps are applied, according to the **Match Index** and the lower handicapper in the match plays off scratch. Order of draw for Match play: 1 v 8; 4 v 5; 2 v 7; 3 v 6.

May : Top 8 pairs qualify for **Phelan Knockout.** Subsequent rounds are to be played by date specified in fixture. (Handicaps are applied, according to the **Match Index**). Lower handicapper plays from scratch and other players adjust accordingly. Order of draw: 1 v 8; 4 v 5; 2 v 7; 3 v 6.

June : **George Veitch Memorial Trophy** (4BBB Par).

Tuesdays:

A men's competition is held each Tuesday. The event is open to visitors.

Thursdays:

A reserve day if a Tuesday or Wednesday competition is cancelled.

Saturdays:

All events are open to visitors and players using reciprocal rights. Intending visitors or players using reciprocal rights may play on competition days with the approval of the appropriate Captain or Secretary if there is sufficient room in the field. However, except for Tournaments and Open events, visitors and players using reciprocal rights are ineligible to win Monthly Medals or "Board Events".

Eagles Nest:

Players who score an Eagle win six balls from the Eagle's Nest.

HEAT POLICY

PRIOR TO DAY OF COMPETITION

Should the forecast temperature on:

- the Thursday evening (prior to a Saturday)
- the Sunday evening (prior to a Tuesday)
- or 48 hours prior to any other Club competition be 40 degrees or above, the afternoon round of that competition shall be cancelled.

While the daily event will proceed (morning only), all competitions associated with qualifying rounds etc will be re-scheduled with a special time sheet posted on the noticeboard. Members are reminded of the dangers associated with extreme weather conditions.

PLEASE:

- wear appropriate clothing including a broad brim hat.
- use liberal amounts of sunscreen.
- drink plenty of fluids (alcohol NOT recommended).
- STOP if distressed.

CONDITIONS OF PLAY FOR CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS (MEN)

The Club Championship and Minor Championships are open to all full golf members who have participated in a minimum of eight (8) competition events in the previous twelve months unless prior approval is given by the Match Committee. The Championships will be played over 3 rounds of stroke play over 18 holes on the days specified.

In the event of a scratch tie holes 17 and 18 (combined total) shall be used as a tie breaker.

Championships will be played in Three Grades with Handicap ranges to be set by the Match Committee.

Handicaps at the commencement of the Championships are retained for the duration of the event.

Trophies **A Grade** - Club Champion Scratch, Winner Handicap.
 B and C Grade – Winners Scratch and Handicap
 Senior (Over 55) – Winners Scratch and Handicap
 Eclectic competition – Kel Bland Trophy

Winners are eligible for more than one trophy because these are Club Championships.

CONDITIONS OF PLAY FOR CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS (WOMEN)

(Alterations may be made at the discretion of the Match Committee)

1. 54 Hole stroke event – Championship Eclectic.
2. Normally three Grades with Grades and Handicap ranges to be set by the Match Committee.
3. Handicaps at the commencement of Championships are retained throughout the Championship rounds.
4. In the event of a tie after 54 holes for any of the three grades in the scratch event there will be a sudden death play-off.
5. The Club Championships are open to all eligible members.

LOCAL COMPETITION RULES (WOMEN)

12 players are needed for Monthly Brooch events.

5-9 players will compete in a competition for a \$25 voucher and 1 ball.

10 –19 players; one grade one winner one runner up

20 – 29 players; two grades (vouchers) 2 winners 2 runner ups

30+ three grades (vouchers) 3 winners 3 runner ups

Medallist of The Year is open to the eligible monthly brooch winners.

When special trophies are played for in three divisions there must be 30+ players or left to the discretion of the Match Committee.

The Match Committee has the right to make the divisions as even as possible.

Players to assemble at 9.15 a.m. on Draw Days for a 9.30 a.m. start (Winter), 8.45 a.m. for 9.00 a.m. (Summer).

Only full members are eligible to win the Monthly Brooch.



LOCAL RULES

LOCAL RULES: (to be read in conjunction with the Rules of Golf).

OUT OF BOUNDS – All ground outside the boundary fences of the Golf Course, including the Bowling Greens and car park fence. (Rule 18)

TREES, SHRUBS, GARDEN BEDS – Relief **MUST** be taken for all planted trees under two club lengths (whether they are staked or not), and all garden beds (Rule 16). Native grasses not adjacent to tees are not garden beds.

PROTECTIVE FENCES – Relief without penalty may be taken under Rule 16, The nearest point of relief must be determined without crossing over, through or under the fence.

FIXED SPRINKLER HEADS – If a ball comes to rest off the putting green, and not in a penalty area, but is within two club lengths of a sprinkler head, which is also within two club lengths of the putting green of the hole being played and which intervenes on the line of play; relief may be taken under Rule 16.

ANT BEDS, WHEEL MARKS AND ROADS – Through the green, greenkeeper's roads and wheel marks made by a mower, tractor or motor vehicle may be treated as Ground Under Repair.

EMBEDDED STONES – Through the green (except in penalty areas), solidly embedded stones interfering with a player's swing (but not their stance) may be treated as Ground Under Repair.

PENALTY AREAS – Red & yellow stakes are movable obstructions.

DISTANCE MARKERS – (Blues 150 metres & White 100 metres) measure from the centre of the fairway to the centre of the green.

RELIEF FROM TREE ROOTS IN OR CLOSE TO A FAIRWAY - If a player's ball lies in the general area and there is interference from exposed tree roots that are in the area cut to fairway height or less, or in the rough within the area from the tree trunk line to the edge of the cut fairway, the tree roots are treated as 'Ground Under Repair'. The player may take free relief under Rule 16.1b.

OOB & LOST BALL LOCAL RULE - When a player's ball has not been found or is known or virtually certain to be out of bounds, the player may proceed under the Stroke and Distance Local Rule for a penalty of two strokes, by dropping a ball in a relief area, rather than proceeding under stroke and distance. This Local Rule is not available if a provisional ball has been played.

MAXIMUM SCORE – Players may opt to use a Maximum Score on any hole. This has been set at Double Par by the Match Committee.

OOB, LOST BALL AND MAXIMUM SCORE LOCAL RULES – Cannot be utilised during “elite” events as defined by the Match Committee.

DROP ZONE FOR 18th TEE - If a player's tee shot on the 18th hole ends up in the dam in front of the tee, or associated drains, the player may choose to play their next shot from the drop zone, which is the forward tee by the gum tree. There is a one shot penalty and they must tee up.

PENALTY FOR BREACH OF LOCAL RULES: Match Play – Loss of hole;
Stroke Play – two (2) strokes.

SLOW PLAY

- **Annoying**
- **Frustrating to fellow competitors**

So, Keep Your Game Moving

The regular occurrence of “slow play” is discussed consistently among members and, with the thought that almost every player-member of the Club has at some time expressed concern about the effects of slow play on their enjoyment of the game, we publish the ten following suggestions which could be of assistance in overcoming the problem.

1. Not being ready on time.

Select club and ball while other players are having their shots.

2. Delays on Tees or Greens while marking the card.

Always mark your card while waiting your turn at the tee.

3. Players wait in a group whilst others play their shots, then walk to their own ball.

Walk directly to your own ball, or level with same; and select club to be used while waiting for others to play their shots. Taking care at all times that you do not put yourself in danger of being hit by other players.

4. Unnecessary number of practice swings.

It is agreed that every player has his own preference in this matter but practice swings should be limited by discretion.

5. Holding Up Play eg When Looking For a Lost Ball.

If it is apparent that you are holding up play, call next group through.

6. Lack of discretion in going through a team that has lost a ball.

If called ahead as in (5) but immediately afterwards the team ahead locate their ball and it is evident that play will proceed faster if they continue, you should signal them to go ahead. Note: The discretion is in the hands of the team called through and not the players who were looking for the lost ball.

7. Unnecessary marking of balls on the putting green and players not continuing to putt out.

When you reach the green immediately study the line of your putt. When it is your turn to putt and wherever possible, putt right out. Marking the ball is sometimes necessary, but not always, and should be avoided.

8. Players not using the time on the green whilst waiting their turns to assess their own putt.

Wherever possible a player should assess his own putt for direction and speed while the other players are putting providing in doing so no interference is caused to other players.

9. Incorrect handling of the flag on the green.

The player whose ball lies nearest the hole should attend the flag and then pass to the first player to hole out and then appraise their own putt.

10. Leaving the buggies around the green.

Always place your buggy adjacent to the approach to the next tee.

It is an expectation of the Golf Committee that four players should be able to complete 18 holes of competition golf in 4 – 4 ¼ hours.
