A total of 20 players from Buninyong, Midlands and Ballarat Golf Clubs took part in the day's competition, while the Maryborough team had the bye for this round.

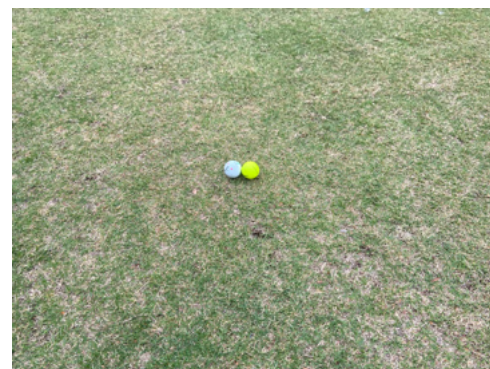

Greetings Members & Staff.

Welcome to our Winter edition of the 2026 club newsletter.

For this edition, I have taken a slightly different approach to my traditional bi-monthly report, providing updates aligned with our "Five Strategic Pillars".



The place to be

1. Tell Our Story Better

- **Strategic Plan Launch:** Hosted three briefing sessions in early May to introduce the club's new 3-year Strategic Plan to staff, committee, and club members.
- **Graphic Design Consultant:** Appointed "Brown Ink Design" to handle branding updates, which already include new directional signage, trading hours, and dress code displays.
- **Biggest Morning Tea:** Raised \$6,426 for the Cancer Council through a collaborative event that included a 72-player golf event and the sale of 46 polo shirts. Congratulations to Amber McKenzie and all who were involved in making this event a huge success. Many thanks to all the staff, volunteers, local partners and suppliers for making this all possible.

2. Attract New Participants

- **Online Booking Platforms:** Launched "TeeNet Booking" on 18 April for golf registrations and introduced "Bowls HQ" to streamline barefoot bowls bookings and promote food/beverage add-ons.
- **Mi-Club Premium Upgrade:** Commenced Phase 1 of the platform upgrade on Thursday, 11 June 2026, to improve the digital user experience for members.
- **Sunday Play:** Introduced a fortnightly Sunday Competition for both adults and juniors starting 14 June 2026.

3. Grow Our Core

- **Club Re-Brand:** Initiated an independent name and branding review with Brown Ink Design, with an upcoming information session planned for members.
- **Climate Action Grant:** Appointed B.F. & R. Douglas Building Consultant to prepare architectural drawings for the "Team Up for Climate Action Grant" opening 11 June 2026, aiming for energy efficiency and operational cost savings.

4. Financial Sustainability

- **EBIT Performance:** Reported a year-to-date EBIT of 6.9% as of 31 May 2026, tracking ahead of the 5% target for FY2026 due to a 12.4% revenue increase.
- **Loan Consolidation:** Working on a proposal with Business & Equipment Finance to consolidate existing loans, which is projected to save \$100,000 annually in interest. PTO

- **Green Fee Restructure:** Rolled out a new fee structure on 6 June 2026, introducing a brand-new 13-hole option to boost average player spend.



5. Work Together

- **Staff Accreditation:** Celebrated the Certificate IV in Leadership and Management completion by four core managers (Luke Fiscalini, Nishant Basnet, Amber McKenzie, and Tori Parker), with two additional staff members currently pursuing further certificates

Superintendent's Report by Mark Firman

Finally some rain has arrived, the irrigation system can be given a rest until next season.

We will be starting to spray broadleaf around the course throughout June, hopefully the weather wont impact this work to much.

Aeration of golf greens and surrounds will be carried out over winter, this will be solid tines and will not impact playability.

COURSE CARE REMINDER

It has been noticeable in recent weeks that there are an increasing number of unrepaired pitch marks on the greens and divots on the fairways.

We ask all players to please take a few extra moments during their round to repair their pitch marks on the greens and fill their divots with sand on the fairways.

These simple actions make a significant difference to the presentation and playing condition of our course and help ensure that everyone can enjoy the best possible golfing experience.

Please remember that if you make a pitch mark, repair it — and if you see another one nearby, consider repairing that as well. Likewise, carrying a sand bucket and filling your divots helps maintain healthy turf and improves conditions for all golfers.
